OWRC Summer Show

We had an excellent show with high attendance and lots of great comments. A big thanks to Olivia for doing such a great job with the announcing and keeping everything moving along, and to Lindsey McPherson for doing an excellent job as the ring steward. Also, thanks to all the helpers including Kelly, Emma, Sarah, Debbie and Juanita.

Rose Voice kindly donated some OWRC mugs for us to sell as a fundraiser. Most of the mugs were sold at the January Show, with only a few left over which were snapped up at the March Show. Rose, thank you for your wonderful donation to the club.

Having the trough was great and it was well used, the carpark layout was excellent with plenty of room. Thanks to Emma for the lovely planter boxes. Emma suggested we could make some permanent timber boxes for the club and maybe use them within the arena for certain classes.

We did receive a few complaints which included the arena surface and a lack of salads for the Saturday night BBQ. This was discussed and the arena resurfacing will happen in due course and more salads would be provided at future shows dependent on the number of entries received indicating attendance. We also decided to provide bottled water for drinking as the water at Telford is not that good for drinking.

There was also mention about a need for training regarding show etiquette when riding around the rail. It was noticed riders were moving in circles instead of across the ring to a clear space. There were also concerns regarding the number of horses in the classes when riding on the rail. We discussed the possibility of the Judge picking the 6 riders with the highest points to go around the rail when the class entries are very large.

We had some issues with a competitor not cleaning up their areas prior to leaving at the end of the show. This member was contacted as it is a violation of our club's rules and unacceptable. We discussed changing the club rules at the Annual General Meeting to enable us to charge a fee for this violation in future.











































OWRC Autumn Show

Our Autumn Show went really well with some good comments including that the class order was great and competitors enjoyed us mixing the classes up a bit, it was lovely to see so many young children out there having a go, and also that the lollies were a great hit with everyone. We also received many comments saying the sound system was excellent, with a speaker outside so everyone would know exactly when things were starting and how long breaks were for and it was also great for the music.

The Judge raised a couple of matters including regarding the arena surface and that the accommodation was of a poor quality. We discussed this and it was decided that in future if we are unable to book accommodation at Bate's Beach at Kaka Point then we will book at the Highway Lodge Motel in Balclutha.

It was noted that some of the yards need repaired and the forks and wheelbarrows were not in good working order. It was discussed that in the past we have repaired the yards, but as this would be an ongoing cost, we believe future repairs should be completed by Telford. It was also decided we would request Telford to purchase some new forks and new tyres for the wheelbarrows as most of them were flat.





















Training in December with Kelly - It was fantastic to have some more training from Kelly in between our shows, everyone enjoyed the weekend and it was very well supported. Thanks to Koriana for having Kelly stay overnight and for dropping her to the airport.

Koriana suggested Rachel Carr may be keen to come down for some training with us and it was discussed that this would be a great idea. The training would be in smaller groups, the same as our usual training sessions. Koriana is going to check with Rachel and advise of possible dates that may suit her.

Diane has penciled in winter training with Kelly in July, August and September and these dates are included in the Upcoming Dates section of the Newsletter. These dates work in with her attending CWRA for training. It was discussed that members need pole work. We could also book training with Ian Loader in the holidays.

Kelly's fees have increased slightly but she has given us a good rate due to the many training weekends we have booked with her in the past. We will send details of the training to members and also everyone who attended our shows.

It was discussed that we could do a survey of training ideas to see what people would like to work on, or if there are any other suggestions.

I'm pleased to say Dad was still doing well enough in the weekend prior to his passing, for me to video call from the show and share how it was going. The biggest highlight being that Chip was so relaxed into the show routine (sour face at other horses not withstanding!) and delivering things that we had been working on. And the cherry on top being the lovely surprise of some ribbons to take home, along with a "wow" from the judge and one of my highest ever scores (HSE pattern), the Versatility win, and our first ever reining patterns. The smile on Dads face to hear all this news was huge.

The committee may be pleased to hear that he had a very cowboy send off. His last meal before he couldn't eat anymore was baked beans. His body was taken home from Hospice in the horse truck which of course he built with Mum all those years ago.

We had no reception or service as he didn't want a fuss and we were in private frame of mind, but he stayed home in his usual place sittin' place in the barn for a couple of days in an understated wooden box, on which we affixed various photos of his life, much dominated by horses of course. His cowboy hat was on top with boots at the foot. And his farriers tools laid on top. No embalming or anything artificial, he was handsome as ever, natural and peaceful.

He went to the crematorium for his last ride in the truck, carried by close friends and lead with a lead rope by Isabella. The small group shared stories of him against a backdrop of country music in an intimate circle around him as we said our goodbyes. We shared whiskey and sausages sitting on hay bales back at the barn and listened to Neon Moon by Brooks and Dunn.

My hope now is that there is a Heaven, and that he is on his horse once again, with his Dad, sending me advice on the wind when I ride.

Thank you once again, and to those who have passed on such lovely messages. Friendship through horsemanship brought to life.

The Sound System

The club has now purchased the sound system and the final version was used at the Autumn Show. We have had amazing comments regarding the sound quality and information provided over the system, also that it was excellent to have the speaker outside to advise everyone about upcoming classes and the times frames for lunch and breaks.

A huge thank you to Juanita for all her work in advising Taff Hewton of our requirements and bringing the various versions of the sound system to Telford and also setting everything up. It has been wonderful to try the systems out to see what would be the best options for the club. Taff attended at Telford multiple times to set everything up and ensure that we have the best system for our club's purposes. We had borrowed a headset from Taff for the March Show and he has ordered one for us, also his travel costs were very reasonable. It is fantastic to have a quality system that will be easily set up.

We are now looking at secure storage options for the sound system to be stored at Telford.

Updating the Club Logo

The Committee have voted unanimously to change the club's logo (which was designed in 1985). It was discussed that the current logo is not a very good design and it could be greatly improved. This discussion was brought about by Diane entering a competition to redesign your logo. Lynda Henderson has kindly offered to design some options for us to review. It was discussed that we should discuss this further at the Annual General Meeting.

Health and Safety

The following health and safety concerns arose during the show season:

- There was an accident at the Summer Show due to a spooked horse trampling someone who was taking a photo. It was discussed that we need a separate quiet area to take photos away from other horses to ensure this kind of accident doesn't happen again. The person had been sore for quite a while following the accident and was given an accident record report form to complete.
- Diane had put a post on Facebook that the arena was hard and in poor condition and that shoes or boots would be required for all horses to attend our shows.
- Julie checked the arena prior to the commencement of the shows and filled in a few rabbit holes.

Health & Safety Reminder:

- In the past rabbit holes have been a problem in the arena and it is a good idea to check the arena prior to riding.
- Please ensure no obstacles are left in the arena or warm up area.
- The mounting block should not be placed near the gate as this may cause an accident.

Constitution/Charities Funding Application

We had the intention of get funding in place to pay for the sound system. The constitution had been amended with marked up changes and was emailed to the committee for review. The Charities Service had also asked some questions that we are required to answer. This will need to be considered by the new Committee following the Annual General Meeting.

Resurfacing of Arena

Diane has advised that Telford have earmarked \$70,000.00 to upgrade the arena. We are hopeful this could possibly be completed over the winter.

- 3. The Executive Committee reserves the right to exercise discretion in any instance where the awarding of a trophy may not be merited.
- Must be a financial member by 31st October each season.

Junior Youth	Highest junior youth points (includes games).
Youth Horse	All youth events except Showmanship
